FEDERAL DISASTER DECLARATION FACT SHEET

SEPTEMBER 1, 2021

On August 23, 2021, President Joseph R. Biden Jr., granted a Major Disaster Declaration for the State of Tennessee triggering the release of Federal funds to help people and communities recover from Severe Storm and Flooding that occurred August 21, 2021. **This disaster declaration has been amended as indicated below in bold.** Details of the disaster declaration and assistance programs are as follows:
